

OBITUARY

Dr. Wilson was a native of Darien, Georgia where he received his early training at St. Cyprian Episcopal School and the Todd Pilgrim Academy. In 1903 he entered Biddle now Johnson C. Smith University, Charlotte, N. C. He finished the Preparatory Course in 1904 and in 1908 was graduated from the college department of the same institution with the A. B. degree.

In 1911 he completed the prescribed training for the ministry in the School of Theology with the S. T. B. Degree.

During his active ministry, he served the following Presbyterian churches; Woodland and Lloyd in Mecklenburg County, Jackson Grove in Union County, Brooklyn Church in Charlotte whicht he was instrumental in organizing.

In 1917 he accepted the call to Westminister Presbyterian Church of Concord, North Carolina, where he served as pastor until he retired in 1957.

After retirement, Dr. Wilson served as temporary Supply Pastor at the Green Street U. P. Church, Morganton, N. C. Later he served in the same capacity at the Bethel U. P. Church, Waxsaw, N. C.

During the early part of his ministry, he served as principal of the Iron Station School in Lincoln County, Woodland School in Mecklenburg County, Mooresville City School, and Rock Hill School in Cabarrus County.

As a presbyter, Dr. Wilson has served in various capacities; among which were: Permanent Clerk, Stated Clerk, Treasurer of Benevolence, Statistician of the Sunday School Conference, and Moderator.

Services to the Synod of Catawba included Moderator, Chairman of Committe on United Promotion, Secretary-Treasurer of Synod Approved Causes, and Editor of Catawba Semi-Annual Review.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Carrie Dockery Wilson of the home, one daughter, Mrs. Helen W. Williams, Cincinnati, Ohio; two sons, Pinckney D. Wilson of Charlotte, N. C. and James E. Wilson of Henderson, N. C., one sister, Mrs. Adelia S. Leake of Savannah, Georgia, and one granddaughter, Ruth Helen Wilson, Henderson, N. C., and other relatives.
