Mr. Oliver was an active member of Memorial Presbyterian Church where he served as elder and member of the Men's Council. He was a member of several civic and social organizations, the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity (Boule), Optimist Civic Club, Swanks Social Club and the Bridgeteers Social Club.
