## **OBITUARY**

Kenneth Senior Powell, affectionately known to his family and friends as Kenny, was born in Nassau, Bahamas on April 28, 1919, to the late David S. Powell and Alberta Powell Draggan. He departed this life on July 26, 1990, at the Carolinas Medical Center.

He was educated in the public schools of New Rochelle, New York; he received his B.S. Degree in Physical Education from Johnson C. Smith University in 1943, where he gained All American and All CIAA status in football. In 1950, he received a Masters Degree from New York University.

During World War II, he served in the Armed Forces. Upon returning from active duty, he was united in marriage to Willie M. King of Chester, South Carolina. This union was blessed with two sons.

His professional career of teaching and coaching young adults began at Howard University, Washington, D.C. in 1948-49. Later, he moved his family to Charlotte, North Carolina, where he accepted the positions as Athletic Director and Head Football Coach at Second Ward High School. In 1961, he joined the Johnson C. Smith University faculty as Professor of Health and Physical Education, Assistant Football Coach and Head Track Coach. He remained in these positions until his retirement in 1985.
