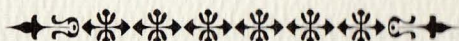

MR. STANLEY COOLIDGE FISHER, son of the late Martha and Roosevelt Fisher, was a native of Lexington, KY. He departed his life Thursday, February 19, 2004, at the home of his daughter. He attended elementary school and high school in Lexington, Kentucky. He received basketball and football scholarships to Fayetteville State College. He was a veteran of World War II. In 1953, he graduated from Hampton University.

A very interesting part of his life was his work history which started at age 11 after the death of his mother -- when he declared his independence. Before entering college, he worked as a horse groomer and trainer, waiter and traveled the Great Lakes as an attendant on passenger cruise ships. Later in life, he was employed as a carpenter, painter, tailor, postal clerk, insurance agent, real estate salesman, housing inspector for the city of Charlotte and as a bus driver for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools.

Survivors are one son, Robert Green; three daughters, Fayon Thompson, Dorothy F. Graves (Ennis), and Deborah Herndon (John); six grandchildren, Tarnisha Previn (Matthew), Ennis Graves, Jr., Derrick Thompson, Tiffany Herndon, Erica Herndon, and Travis Herndon; and a host of other relatives and friends.
