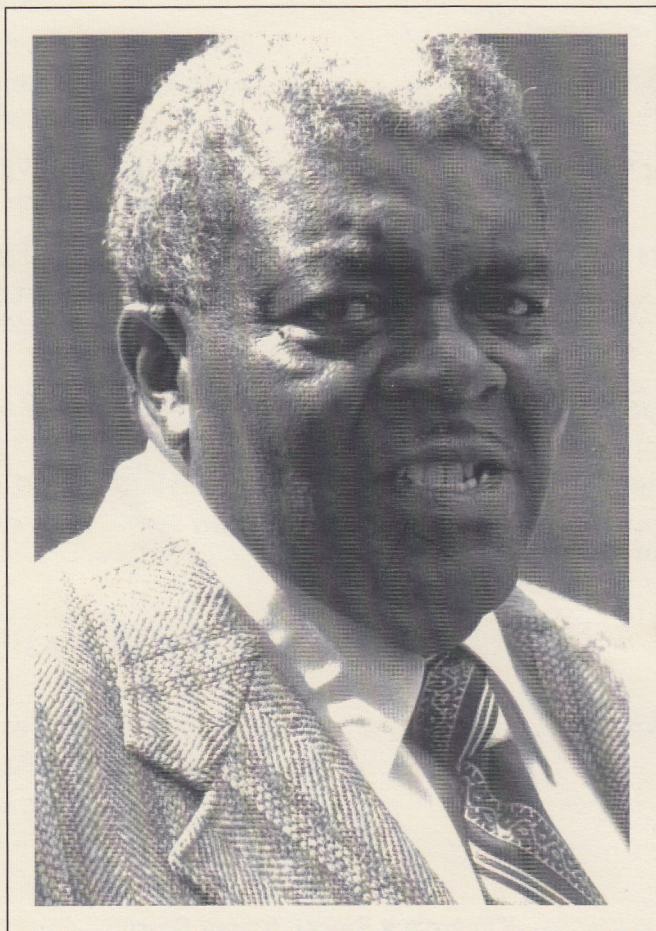

The Obituary

The Reverend Samuel Levi Fulwood, Jr., esteemed minister, peacefully departed his earthly life on Monday, December 10, 2007, at Carolinas Medical Center Hospital in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Born in Waxhaw, North Carolina on October 12, 1925, he was the third of five children born to respected educators, the late Reverend Samuel Levi Fulwood, Sr. and Rosa McKnight Fulwood. Also known as "June", he exemplified a desire for education through attending Colter School in Cheraw, South Carolina. Later in 1948, he graduated from Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, North Carolina. It was there that he also became a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated. Following graduation, he began seminary, also at Johnson C. Smith University, where he graduated.

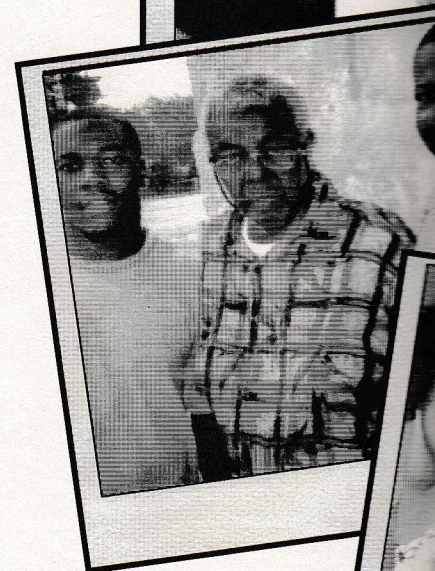
His pastoral care included ministering at Allen Temple United Presbyterian Church in Cleveland, North Carolina, Freedom Presbyterian Church in Statesville, North Carolina, and Bellefonte Presbyterian Church in Harrisburg, North Carolina until his retirement. Following his retirement he served as a supply pastor for several Presbyterian churches in this area. His hours of duty were not limited only to Sunday worship. He ministered to the sick and shut-in, made many hospital visits, bonded unions of matrimony, and endlessly lived for the Lord.

A believer of family strength, "June" married the former Hallie Bernice Massey in 1951, and born to this union were two sons, Samuel, III, and George. He proudly supported his wife's career as an elementary teacher, was devoted to his sons, and delighted in his expanding family of three grandchildren.
