Biographic Profile Dr. Esther Page Hill

Dr. Esther Page Hill was the daughter of the late Rev. Oscar Leonadas Page and Mrs. Lucille Alice Page. She was born in Rocky Mount, North Carolina, the only daughter of a teacher and minister. Very early, the family moved to Brooklyn, New York where she grew up and attended private elementary schools in Brooklyn and Bridgeport, Connecticut. She graduated from a Brooklyn private high school, Greater New York Academy. Dr. Ester Page Hill spent her college years at North Carolina College in Durham, North Carolina, and Teachers College, Columbia University in New York City, New York, where she earned the Bachelor of Science in Social Studies. Shortly thereafter, she married the late Mr. Samuel Hill. They attended First Baptist Church –West where she was very active on boards and committees.

Following two years of teaching Social Studies and Art in the public schools of Williamsburg, Virginia, Esther returned to New York City where she taught Art in junior high school for four years, before returning to North Carolina with her husband Sam. Soon thereafter, she was accepted in the masters program at Teachers College, Columbia University where she completed the Master of Arts Degree in Fine Arts and Fine Arts Education with an emphasis in textile design.

Dr. Esther Hill's next position was as an Art Consultant and Art Supervisor in the Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools in Charlotte, North Carolina where she remained until joining the Visual Art Faculty at The University of North Carolina at Charlotte. She was an Associate Art Professor of Visual Arts, and a member of the Graduate Faculty. During her tenure at the University, she received the North Carolina Board of Governors' Doctoral Study Award. She applied and was accepted in the Doctoral Program at Florida State University where she completed her work for the Ph. D in Art Education.
