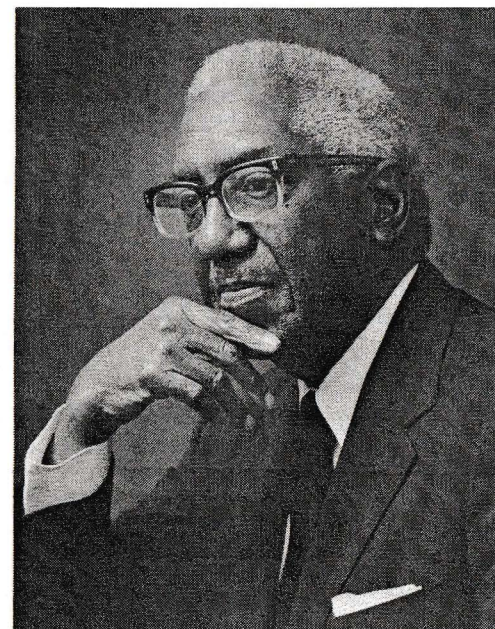

## Obituary

A true servant of humanity has gone to his reward, after practicing medicine for than fifty years.

DR. ROBERT HADLEY GREENE, son of the late Daisy and Robert Ber Greene, was born in Washington, D.C. on August 21, 1900. He departed this Presbyterian Hospital, Charlotte, North Carolina on Friday, November 23, 1951.

Dr. Greene received his early education in the District of Columbia School System. He then enrolled in Howard University where he remained to complete undergraduate studies (B.S. Degree) and his work in the School of Medicine which he received his Doctor of Medicine Degree.

After moving to Charlotte to begin his practice, he served as a member of the American Medical Association, was a life member of the National Medical Association Incorporated, and of the Old North State Medical Society. He was former president of the Charlotte Medical Society which honored him by naming him "Man of the Year."

Dr. Greene was a charter member of the Charlotte Chapter of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated, and was honored by this group as its outstanding member brother.

He also served on the board of directors for his fraternity. His affiliations included membership in the Beta Delta Chapter of Sigma Pi Psi Boulevard.

Dr. Greene was a devoted and faithful member of First United Presbyterian Church, attending regularly as long as he was able to do so. As an Elder, he served several terms on the session, lending the expertise of his knowledge and experiences to the decision-making body of his church. He was also a member of the Presbyterian Men's Organization, the Martin-Sanders Sunday School Class and a staunch supporter of all of the church's programs. His passing will leave a void in the congregation.

The memory of Dr. Greene will be cherished by his loving wife, Susan Boulware Greene; his caring congregation and the devoted neighbors in his community.
